


You are invited to come and enjoy our

Wildlife, Cowboy, & Texas Longhorn Photography Workshop

on the historic Double Circle Ranch. Bring your camera and photograph the country famous for outlaws, renegade Indians and wild cattle. The Texas longhorn cattle are tamer now- but the country is still remote and wild. Capture the American West complete with cowboys, chuckwagon, longhorns, and cowponies as well as wildlife and spectacular scenery. You are invited to a three-day photographic workshop from April 17-20, 2012 with international wildlife and nature photographer Tom Whetten. Come add to your portfolio and photographic knowledge while enjoying the scenic beauty of Upper Eagle Creek, Arizona. The Double Circle is located on the creek with streamside cottonwoods, midelevation junipers, and high elevation Ponderosa pines.



The workshop will feature a Texas Longhorn cattle drive where you can take up close and personal photographs. You will visit ponds frequented by neo-tropical and migratory birds along with other species of wildlife. Evenings will be spent discussing topics such as; Depth of Field, Photoshop for Photographers, shooting RAW or jpeg and open sessions to address your topics. Two daily photo sessions will be conducted by Tom around the ranch including riparian and upland habitats. Wildlife species such as the endangered Mexican Grey wolf, elk, deer, antelope, and mountain lions call the ranch home along with more than 130 species of birds.



Tom brings to this workshop knowledge of wildlife and nature gathered over a life-

spacious wall tents with private decks, toilets, hot and cold running water and showers, home cooked meals served family style, ranch tours, workshop handouts and notes and transportation on the ranch. The workshop is limited to eight guests allowing us to provide everyone with a quality experience.
